The Lost Lake-Randolph Historical Society is one of thirteen local historical societies in Dodge County and is affiliated with the State Historical Society.

The society was formed in 2001 by concerned area residents seeking to preserve the old St. Mary's Church at Lost Lake.

The church now houses a local history museum with a wide variety of exhibits, including extensive information on area one-room schools, cheese factory and farming history, military uniforms, and Randolph Fire Department history.

Additional exhibits include a 10' x 14' model train set, antique clothing and hats, a vintage kitchen, and natural history items previously displayed at Nature Land.

Our largest project to date was relocating the Lost Lake School to the museum grounds and restoring it to create an authentic one-room school exhibit.

Each year we add more to our museum, preserving artifacts and sharing the knowledge of how our local community was shaped by people and events.
